

## Mission Patch Specifications Mars 2001-2002

Every year, members of the Space Simulation design a mission patch to sew onto our flight suits. You can view examples of previous patch designs in the archives section. Designs should meet all of the following specifications:

- The patch should preferably be round so as to cut down on printing costs.
- The design itself should include the following:
  - A Canadian emblem, maple leaf, or other such insignia—an American flag is not applicable this year;
  - A representation of the Galileo shuttle, an STS-series shuttle, any of the X-series experimental air/spacecraft, or some other applicable space vehicle—keep in mind that the Hawking II is currently in the design phase and will be used for the mission, so drawing the obsolete Hawking I in may not be a good idea;
  - One of the following terms: ‘OCESS’, ‘Ottawa-Carleton Educational Space Simulation’, ‘OCE Space Simulation’, or some other variant; e-mail the mission commanders for clarification if necessary;
  - The term ‘Mars 2002’;
  - Few colours—the fewer, the better; this saves on printing costs. About three is a good number, in addition to black and white. Might we humbly suggest red?
- The submission can either be on paper or in a high-quality image file—jpeg, gif, or some other commonly recognized format.
- The submission must be made by the end of November.
